- Plant selection is based on supporting creatures throughout the year.

Habitat garden maintenance:

- Flowers are allowed to go to seed to provide food.
- Pruning takes place in early spring to avoid disturbing nesting birds.
- All pruned branches and plant debris are left under plant.
- Leaves are used for mulch instead of wood bark mulch.
- Open soil areas are left available for native bee homes.
- Some areas are densely planted for shelters/hiding.
