## Redflower buckwheat

Eriogonum grande



**Description: Redflower buckwheat** has a long bloom
time so attracts many butterflies,
bees and other pollinators. Seeds
provide food for birds in winter
when other sources are scarce.



Light: Full Sun



**56** species of butterflies and moths can lay eggs on this plant.



Featured Butterfly: The Gray
Hairstreak can often be found
frequenting flowers in home
gardens. Other plants this small
butterfly can lay its eggs on include
California lilac, coffeeberry,
buckwheat, wild rose, and lupine.

**Keystone Plant:** This California native is a "must have" (host) plant for caterpillars, which, in turn, are the "must have" food for baby birds.
