# Redflower buckwheat

*Eriogonum grande*



**Description: Redflower buckwheat** has a long bloom time so attracts many butterflies, bees and other pollinators. Seeds provide food for birds in winter when other sources are scarce.



**Light: Full Sun**



**56** species of butterflies and moths can lay eggs on this plant.



**Featured Butterfly: The *Gray Hairstreak*** can often be found frequenting flowers in home gardens. Other plants this small butterfly can lay its eggs on include California lilac, coffeeberry, buckwheat, wild rose, and lupine.

**Keystone Plant:** This California native is a “must have” (host) plant for caterpillars, which, in turn, are the “must have” food for baby birds.
