A Must-Have California Native Plant!

Elderberry

Sambucus mexicana



Description: Elderberry grows quickly and can reach between 15' – 30' in height in just a few years. Its lovely cream-colored flowers are followed by blue berries that are one of the most important fruit sources for birds in all of California.



Light: Full Sun / Part or Full Shade



31 species of butterflies and moths can lay eggs on this plant.



Featured Moth: The Salt Marsh Moth can be seen in the garden from May through August. As a caterpillar, it feeds on coyote brush, then forms a chrysalis on the ground in the leaves below. You can help them by leaving the leaves in your garden!

Keystone Plant: This California native is a "must have" (host) plant for caterpillars, which, in turn, are the "must have" food for baby birds.
