A Must-Have California Native Plant!

Silver Lupine

Lupinus albifrons



Description: Silver Lupine is a lovely mounding perennial shrub with silvery leaves and spires of rich purple blooms in early spring.



Light: Full Sun

75 species of butterflies and moths can lay eggs on this plant.

Featured Butterfly: The tiny, gossamer-winged Acmon Blue butterfly can be seen fluttering in the garden from March through November. Its caterpillars rest for the winter on the plant or in the leaf litter below it. You can help them by leaving the leaves in your garden!

Keystone Plant: This California native is a "must have" (host) plant for caterpillars, which, in turn, are the "must have" food for baby birds.
