A Must-Have California Native Plant!

Manzanita

Arctostaphylos species



Description: Manzanitas are evergreen, water-conserving plants with distinctive red bark. Forms include trees, shrubs and groundcovers, all bearing attractive flowers in winter and early spring, followed by berries.



Light: Full Sun



68 species of butterflies and moths can lay eggs on this plant.

Featured Butterfly: The tiny Brown Elfin butterfly has a 1" wingspan. As a caterpillar, it feeds on manzanitas, then forms a chrysalis on the ground in the leaves below. Over the winter birds rely on these for food, so be sure to leave the leaves!

Keystone Plant: This California native is a "must have" (host) plant for caterpillars, which, in turn, are the "must have" food for baby birds.
