

A Must-Have California Native Plant!

White Sage

Salvia apiana



Description: The tall **White Sage** is a statement plant in the garden, with its glowing white foliage, tall spires of white flowers and 5' stature. It requires no additional water after becoming established.



Light: Full Sun



65 species of butterflies and moths can lay eggs on this plant.



Featured Moth: The **Wavy Lined Emerald Moth** has an unusual adaptation. In its caterpillar stage it camouflages itself with tiny bits of the plant it is eating, attaching them with its silk. If it moves to a different type of plant, it replaces its 'outfit' with fresh material to match.

Keystone Plant: This California native is a "must have" (host) plant for caterpillars, which, in turn, are the "must have" food for baby birds.
