## Narrow Leaf Milkweed Asclepias fascicularis



**Description: Narrow Leaf Milkweed** has delicate flowers which are attractive to bees, butterflies and other pollinators. Its leaves provide food for the caterpillars of the endangered Monarch butterfly.



Light: Sun or Part Shade

A Must-Have Plant: Milkweed is the only plant that monarch butterflies can reproduce on. Plant some to help ensure their survival.

Featured Butterfly: Western Monarchs can be seen in gardens across the West from March through November, sipping nectar from a variety of flowers and laying eggs on milkweed. For the remainder of the year they cluster in overwintering sites along the California coast. Grow their favorite nectar plants: yarrow, goldenrod, asters, and sunflowers.
