A Must-Have California Native Plant!

Oregon White Oak *Quercus garryana*



Description: Oregon White Oak or Garry Oak can be grown as a tree or shrub. Its large, lobed leaves, which drop in the fall, nourish the soil and provide shelter for caterpillars.




- **270** species of butterflies and moths can lay eggs on this plant.
 - **Fun Fact:** "Oaks support more life forms and more fascinating interactions than any other genus in North America." Doug Tallamy
- Featured Butterfly: In its caterpillar stage, the elegant *California Sister* dines exclusively on oaks and is a vital food source for many species of birds.

Keystone Plant: This California native is a "must have" (host) plant for caterpillars, which, in turn, are the "must have" food for baby birds.
